This Disclosure describes the European Bond Asset Fund (EKA) investments that promote environmental and social characteristics and sustainable investment objectives.

As stated in the investment policy of the European Bond Asset Fund (EKA), the objective of the European Bond Asset Fund is: to achieve a return above the euro bond market average by investing primarily in euro-denominated bonds.

The Fund invests primarily in euro-denominated government bonds issued by European countries, as well as corporate bonds, bonds issued by credit institutions and mortgage bonds. The Manager may also invest in euro-denominated corporate bonds issued by the European subsidiaries of non-European companies and may hold part of the assets in euro bank deposits in order to achieve its objective.

The portfolio of the asset fund may also include bank account money, bank deposits and short-term Hungarian government bonds. The Fund Manager may also implement the investment strategy by purchasing, using all or part of the assets of the Asset Fund, securities of collective investment schemes managed by fund managers with a sound background, whose investment strategy is identical in all material respects to the strategy of the Asset Fund.

The EKA is considered a **low-risk investment** over the long term. However, due to the longer average maturity of the EIF, the risk of the asset fund is higher than that of asset funds investing in shorter-dated securities, and the price of the units of the EIF may fall in the short term. The assets of the EKA are partly or fully invested in foreign currencies

(mainly the euro), so the exchange rate of the units is also affected by movements in the forint against foreign currencies.

As set out in the investment policy of the Climate and Environmental Protection Stock Fund (KLA), the objective of the Asset Fund is to achieve long-term capital growth through a diversified portfolio of equity or equity-related investments in companies that are expected to directly or indirectly benefit from developments addressing environmental challenges, such as climate change.

The Asset Fund was launched in October 2024 and invests a significant portion of its assets in an Underlying Fund, meaning that its environmental and social characteristics and investments promoting sustainable investment objectives are essentially determined by the investments of the Underlying Fund. As the Asset Fund was not yet operational for a significant part of the Underlying Fund's financial year under review, and due to its start-up and growth phase, the proportion of cash and liquid assets in its portfolio may have temporarily exceeded the target ratio set out in the prospectus, therefore no proportional adjustment has been made. Accordingly, the disclosure pursuant to Article 10 of the SFDR for 2024 is based entirely on the sustainability disclosure of the Underlying Fund. The Underlying Fund invests in companies that provide environmental solutions and contribute to social outcomes. These companies are part of its proprietary investment universe and engage in economic activities considered environmentally or socially sustainable. Thus, the primary objective of the Underlying Fund (thus, of the Asset Fund) is to achieve sustainable investments, which includes the commitment to ensure that a specified minimum portion of the portfolio composed of sustainable investments. These are screened to ensure that they do not significantly hamper any social or environmental investment objectives. The asset allocation of the Underlying Fund is presented in the form of a chart that holds a specification of the minimum percentage of environmental and/or social sustainable investments that the fund commits to invest into. Specific sustainability indicators will be used to measure the attainment of the sustainable investment objective of the Underlying Fund in accordance with the methodologies described below. Internal limit monitoring systems run pre- and post-trade screenings for the holdings. Internal and external data sources and data providers are used to ensure that the Underlying Fund is invested in accordance with the sustainable investment objective. Data received from external providers may be complemented by internal research and analysis. The asset manager of the Underlying Fund aims to mitigate limitations to data sources by applying solid due diligence measures in relation to external data providers, and manual verification processes. It undertakes a range of engagement activities on behalf of its clients to encourage improved ESG practices. There is no reference benchmark designated for the purpose of attaining the sustainable investment objective of the Underlying Fund (thus, of the Asset Fund).

To maintain liquidity, the Asset Fund 's portfolio may also include bank deposits and cash held in bank accounts.

The Manager may also execute the investment strategy by purchasing securities of collective investment schemes managed by reliable asset managers, using the assets of the Asset Fund partially or entirely, whose investment strategies are substantially aligned with the strategy of the Asset Fund.

The Asset Fund is considered a **medium-high risk investment**, which is expected to achieve returns exceeding the market yield level. As a result, the unit price of the Asset Fund may decrease in the short and medium term.
